Character Evaluation survey completed by NPHS teachers	Revised: Consider a student's pattern of behavior regarding involvement and activities instead of requiring a minimum number of application points	
Earn and maintain a minimum GPA of 3.3 / 4.0 scale	Application forms will be due Friday, May 21, 2021. Late applications will not be accepted. Absence from school that day does not extend the due date.

National Honor Society Application Process

The National Honor Society application process not only confirms a student's academic success, but also documents a pattern of community and school service, participation, and involvement.

Once a student has been inducted into the NHS, he or she will no longer have to document points; instead, the student will demonstrate continued involvement by documenting at least 5 hours of service per semester.

Application Requirements

Earn and maintain a minimum GPA of 3.3 / 4.0 scale

Character Evaluation survey completed by NPHS teachers

For incoming junior/sophomore-at-time-of-application candidates, this evaluation is based upon conduct during the freshman and sophomore years. For incoming senior/junior-at-time-of-application candidates, this evaluation is based upon conduct during the freshman, sophomore, and junior years.

The areas of evaluation are cooperation, courtesy, determination, industry, and integrity. Applicants should average 4.5/5.0 scale

Activities and Participation Points

Revised: Consider a student's pattern of behavior regarding involvement and activities instead of requiring a minimum number of application points.

NHS Guidelines:

Sophomores: 60 points in at least two different activity areas <u>OR</u>, Juniors: 100 points in three different activity areas.

Instructions for Calculating Activity Points

Activity points measure your participation in the activities at NPHS and in your community. Each participant in an activity can receive points based on personal involvement and success of the group. The more you participate, the more points you get.

- 1) It is your responsibility to ask sponsors/coaches to fill out forms
- 2) BEFORE you give the sheet to your sponsor/coach you need to fill out:
 - 1. your name and graduation year
 - 2. the activity code see the list above
 - 3. the activity name of the group/team/club, etc.
 - 4. your status in the activity/group member, captain, officer, etc.
- 3) Document points earned while a high school student, grades 9, 10, 11

Activity Point Scale

Points are earned for service and leadership.

Points are awarded by semester OR by athletic season

Students who participate in multiple seasons of multiple sports should include all appropriate points

Students may include activities from the start of their freshman year at NPHS
